## **Street Parking**

The streets are owned by the State of Delaware, not Whethersfield. Anyone can park anywhere absent a restriction by the State (too close to a corner or blocking access to or from a driveway). In these cases, NCC Police (573-2800) can be called.

Additionally, NCC Code Enforcement can be called if someone is parking on the grass (NCC Code violation 395-5555). Please be aware if a mailbox is blocked by a parked vehicle, the postal delivery person is not obligated to leave the mail. Keep in mind the need for emergency vehicles to get through on narrow streets.

#### Basketball Hoops

Basketball Hoops—We are a family friendly community and basketball hoops, bike riding and skateboarding keep kids active and foster friendships. There is no NCC Code restriction that prohibits the use/play of basketball hoops in the communities unless it creates a traffic safety hazard or if the participants are creating a disturbance. If you do experience an issue, call Police nonemergency at 302-573-2800.
